

Airline Baggage Guidelines

Updated: August 2009

Baggage restrictions imposed by airlines request that passengers follow these guidelines:

| <p>Carry-On Luggage:</p> <p>One item weighing less than 40 pounds and one personal item such as a purse, a briefcase, or camera case, diaper bag,</p> | <p>Checked Luggage:</p> <p>Two items weighing less than 50 pounds each</p> |

These additional items are usually okay to **carry-on** and do not count towards your allowances:

- Food items for immediate consumption
- Assistive devices such as wheelchairs or crutches, provided passenger is dependent on them
- One box or bag of duty free merchandise
- A coat or jacket
- An umbrella
- One item of reading material
